# GENERAL INFORMATION

## DEADLINES

- **ALL ENTRIES MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE. THERE WILL BE NO PAPER ENTRIES.**
- Entry Deadline - Entries must be submitted online by **May 1, 2018.**
- Entries submitted online after May 1, 2018 until May 10, 2018 will be required to pay double entry fees.
- **OWNERSHIP DATE - Entry must be solely in the exhibitor's name by May 1, 2018.**
- **Registration information must clear the AMAA office by May 1, 2018.**
  - Please allow 10 business days for the registration process to be completed.
- **NO SUBSTITUTIONS WILL BE ALLOWED.**

## ELIGIBILITY & AGE OF CONTESTANTS

Participants must be members in good standing with the American Junior Maine-Anjou Association (AJMAA) and cannot have reached their 22nd birthday prior to January 1 the year of the show.

- For example, you must have a birthday **AFTER JANUARY 1, 1996** to be eligible for this year's junior show in Grand Island.

## AGE DIVISIONS

Age divisions are determined on January 1 of the year the show.

- Junior - 12 years of age and younger
- Intermediate - 13-16 years of age
- Senior - 17-22 years of age **\*\*Must have a birthday AFTER JANUARY 1, 1996 to be eligible for this year's junior show\*\***

## FEES

- AJMAA dues - \$25. Junior dues must be paid in full for entries to be processed.
  - Bedding fee - \$45 per head. (This includes both **INDOOR & OUTDOOR/TIEOUT** bedding.)
  - Entry fee - \$55 per entry. **Bred and owned entry fees are separate from owned entry fees.**
  - **\*\*If you are entering in the Bred & Owned AND Owned Show the entry fee is \$80 + bedding = \$125.**
- We do not assume that just because an animal is bred & owned that you also want to show it in the owned show. YOU MUST ENTER IN BOTH SHOWS.\*\***

- For example if your animal qualifies for both shows you will choose the **Bred & Owned AND Owned MaineTainer** option from the pull down menu.

- Banquet ticket - \$30.
  - NOTE: Each exhibitor will receive a complimentary banquet ticket.
  - Banquet meal includes: 8 oz steak, baby new red potatoes, green beans, tossed salad, dinner roll and dessert.*
- Meal ticket - \$30: Meal tickets must be purchased. No one will receive a meal ticket. Tickets are good for one meal on Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday.
  - Meals include: (Tuesday) Cheesesteak sandwich, ranch pasta salad, chips, brownie & Drink (Wednesday) Nacho bar with handmade chips, queso, taco meat and all the toppings, cookie bar and drink. (Thursday) Grilled hamburgers or chicken, mac n cheese, cowboy beans, scotcheroos and drink.*

- Extra t-shirt - \$15.
- Contest Only Fee- \$30 (If you're not showing an animal, but wish to participate in the contests you will pay this fee. You **DO NOT** pay this fee if you enter an animal.)
- Novice Only Fee- \$20 (If you're not showing an animal, but wish to participate in the novice activities

# RULES & REGULATIONS

## AMAA RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Exhibitors are subject to all rules and regulations of the American Maine-Anjou Association (AMAA). When an entry is made, exhibitors agree to abide by the rules and regulations established by the AMAA, as well as the rules of the show management. Entries found to be misrepresented and persons not abiding by the show rules will be disqualified.
- Once an animal is unloaded from a trailer at the show grounds, said animal may not enter the trailer again until departing the show facility not to return. Any animal found entering a trailer during the show will be immediately disqualified. \*\*If for any reason an animal does need to re-enter a trailer it will be at the discretion of the Executive Vice President and show staff.\*\*
- Protest Rule - Protests must be submitted in writing at least 24 hours prior to the beginning of judging or at the conclusion of judging. Written protests are accompanied by a \$500 fee and three (3) signatures of current AMAA members. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation and depending on the basis of the protest a decision may be withheld until a complete investigation is made. If the protest is upheld the \$500 will be refunded.
- All animals must be registered with the AMAA. The original registration certificate is required at check-in.
- **Tattoos will be checked**, must be legible and correspond exactly with the original registration certificate. We will not check tattoos on animals if they have been previously AMAA, Oklahoma Maine-Anjou Association, Iowa Maine-Anjou Association or Ohio Best Association verified. Other than Brucellosis Calhoun tattoos, there shall be no other permanent identification marks other than those noted on the certificate of registry.
- The attempted surgical or non-surgical alteration or conformation of an animal is strictly prohibited, except for dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation. If an exhibitor's animal is found to have been physically altered the following actions will be enforced:
  1. The exhibitor will be banned from all AMAA shows for one (1) year from the offense.
  2. The animal will be banned from exhibition for life.
  3. If exhibitor is guilty for the second offense they will be barred for life from AMAA activities.
- The use of false tail heads, added hair or other materials to any part of the animal's body is prohibited.
- The dying or artificial changing of the existing color and color pattern is prohibited.
- No artificial filling (pumping).
- All horned animals more than seven months of age must be dehorned.
- Any and all cattle shall be made available to have blood drawn or hair pulled for parentage verification, detection of foreign substances or the presence of altering. If recorded parent is excluded as a result of DNA typing, the owner can, at his expense, request the AMAA to determine actual parentage. Failure to determine parentage will result in disqualification of that animal from the AMAA herd book.
- Heifers exhibited at 20 months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy. Heifers used in embryo transfer must be accompanied by a certificate of positive fertility issued by a licensed veterinarian.
- The show superintendent will split classes as near to equal as possible.

# RULES & REGULATIONS

## AJMAA NATIONAL SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Show entries must be owned solely by the exhibitor.
- Participants must exhibit their show entries.  
**Exceptions:**
  - An exhibitor has more than one animal in the same class, in which another junior national participant may help by showing one of the animals.
  - Injury or illness (medical note from a doctor).
  - The Youth committee will review other circumstances.
- Official t-shirts are required while exhibiting animals and will be available at check-in. You are not required to wear show t-shirts during showmanship.
- Exhibitors must wear show harnesses to exhibit entry numbers.
- States are to stall together in assigned locations during the show. **Chi's and Maines will all be stalled by state.**
- Animal health commission rules and regulations of the host state will be enforced.
- Cattle are not allowed to leave prior to the conclusion of the show.
- Overhead fans are to be hung in the front half of stalls. Signs will be hung on the aisles as to what direction your fans should be pointed.
- **NO TENTS ARE ALLOWED IN TIEOUTS.**
- **NO PENS ARE ALLOWED IN TIEOUTS.**
- **NO FAN CAGES OR BUTT FANS ARE ALLOWED.**
- **NO SWAMP COOLERS ALLOWED.**
- Decisions of Show and Youth committees are final.

# SHOW INFORMATION

## **THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW:**

1. All animals must be registered in the **EXHIBITORS NAME ONLY**.
2. If the dam of a bred & owned animal is from another breed they must have a registration certificate showing ownership. They will also need to have the pedigree added. **NO COMMERCIAL OR FOUNDATION DAMS ARE ACCEPTED AS BRED & OWNED.**
3. **If you plan to show in both the bred & owned and owned heifer shows you must enter in both shows. We do not assume that just because the animal is bred & owned that you want to be in both shows.**

## **BRED AND OWNED INFORMATION:**

- **We do not assume that just because an animal is bred & owned that you also want to show it in the owned show. YOU MUST ENTER IN BOTH SHOWS.**

Exhibitor must be listed as **breeder and owner** on original registration certificate on bred and owned entries. Dams of MaineTainer females and steers do not have to be registered Maine-Anjou or MaineTainer as long as the dam is registered in another breed's registry and on file at the American Maine-Anjou Association. If the calf's dam is registered with another breed, a copy of the dam's registration paper must be sent to the AMAA office to prove ownership in the exhibitor's name at the time of conception. **Bred and owned entries out of COMMERCIAL, FOUNDATION and NON-REGISTERED dams are not allowed.**

- Bulls must be born on or after Jan. 1, 2016.

Entries must meet all requirements of bred and owned entries explained above. You are NOT required to pay the additional bred and owned entry fee for bulls, as there will only be a bred and owned show.

**\*\*Any bull that you wish to show must be TH/PHA free by parents or be free by test. Carriers will no longer be registered or shown.\*\***

- Exhibitor must be listed as breeder and owner on original registration certificate on bred and owned entries.
  - Bred & owned entries can be still be registered if their dam is registered in another association, if the dam is registered in another breed's registry her pedigree will need to be added and on file at the American Maine-Anjou Association. A copy of the dam's registration paper must be sent or e-mailed to the AMAA office to prove ownership in the exhibitor's name at the time of conception.
  - **Bred and owned entries out of COMMERCIAL, FOUNDATION and NON-REGISTERED dams are not allowed.**
  - Bulls must be born on or after Jan. 1, 2017.
  - If entering a Bred & Owned MaineTainer bull, you will select **Bred & Owned MaineTainer Bull** from the pull down.
- \*\*Any bull that you wish to show must be TH/PHA free by parents or be free by test. Carrier will no longer be registered or shown.\*\***

Maine Angus refers to cattle with the following characteristics:

- The animal will have between 3/8 Maine-Anjou to 5/8 Maine-Anjou blood and have between 1/4 registered Angus to 5/registered Angus and/or registered Red Angus blood.
- A registered Maine Angus female must be proven free of PHA and TH, whether identified by pedigree or test.
- **NOTE: If you have a bred & owned Maine Angus, they will show in the Bred & Owned MaineTainer show. You will select Bred & Owned MaineTainer AND Owned Maine-Angus from the drop down.**

# AJMAA QUEEN

## NATIONAL MAINE-ANJOU QUEEN

- Eligibility requirements:
  - Applicant must be in good standing with the AJMAA.
  - Participated in one (1) previous junior national shows. Will be required to list year and name of show.

## AMAA SCHOLARSHIP - TWO - \$1,000

The American Maine-Anjou Association Scholarship Award is presented annually and will be announced at the AMAA National Junior Maine-Anjou Show each year. The number of scholarships awarded will be decided at the AMAA annual meeting according to the interest earned that year. This year, two (2) scholarships at \$1,000 will be awarded. Successful applicants will receive a scholarship to attend the college, university or other school of their choice the fall semester immediately following selection. The scholarship must be used within 12 months of issuance. Money forfeited will be returned to the AMAA Scholarship Fund.

### Qualifications:

1. Applicant must be a current dues paying member of the American Junior Maine-Anjou Association.
2. Applicant must be at least a graduating high school student, but must not have reached their 21st birthday prior to May 1 of the current year.

# CONTESTS

## CONTESTS

Recently the American Junior Maine-Anjou and American Junior Chianina Associations came together with a plan to streamline the contest process and duration of the junior national. The decision was made to combine all of the contests with the exception of Showmanship. The addition of a novice division was also added.

## AWARDS

- First through 10th place will be recognized.
- Ties will no longer be awarded.
- First through 10th place will be presented with a certificate and award.

## CONTEST GUIDELINES & STRUCTURE

The American Junior Maine-Anjou & Chianina junior boards made the decision in 2017 to streamline their approach when it came to the National Junior Heifer Show and its contests. The hopes of this new process is to cut down on overall days spent at the show. One such way that was decided was to combine the following contests: Photo, Quiz Bowl, Salesmanship, Public Speaking and Livestock Judging. One contest will still be held separately and that is Showmanship. There will no longer be a Stockman's Challenge or Poster contest offered at junior national.

### So, what does this mean?

For example, where there used to be a top 10 in both Maine-Anjou public speaking and Chianina public speaking in each age division, there will now only be one top 10 public speaking in each age division. This means that top 10 can be made up of exhibitors from each breed.

### Showmanship

The only exception to the new contest format is Showmanship. Each breed will continue to hold a separate showmanship contest and each contestant will receive 3 points regardless of where they place. If you choose to compete in both showmanships you will still only receive the 3 points that will go towards the overall sweepstakes. Awards will be presented to the top 1-5 in each breeds contest.

### Do you have to enter both breeds to be part of the contests?

No. As long as you're a current dues paid member of either association and have submitted a cattle entry or the contest only fee you are signed up. **YOU DO NOT HAVE TO PAY THE CONTEST ONLY FEE IF YOU ENTER AN ANIMAL AND YOU DO NOT HAVE TO ENTER AN ANIMAL IN BOTH BREEDS.**

## NOVICE DIVISION

We love our littles! With no minimum age, the AJMAA and AJCA have many participants that are below the age of 8. With this many young exhibitors the decision was made to vamp up our novice program and offer activities a few afternoons that are geared specifically for the Littles. Additionally, we have many of our exhibitors that attend the show with their old siblings and would love to participate but just aren't quite ready. We have those exhibitors covered too! For 3 afternoons we invite our Littles to come and enjoy activities like steer cookie decorating, heifer cutout coloring and more! Each activity will last approximately 1 – 1 ½ hours and all items they will need will be provided.

So, how do you sign your little up for these activities?

- If your child is 8 or below and is exhibiting an animal, you will choose the "Novice" pull down from the age divisions. This will sign them up for all activities and showmanship.
- If your child is 8 or below and is not exhibiting an animal, you will choose "Novice" and the cost will be \$20 for materials.

NOTE: There will be an option for a novice quizbowl and you will sign up for that at check-in.

If your child would like to compete in the speech, salesmanship, team fitting, livestock judging or photo they will compete as juniors.

- A random presentation order will be posted prior to the contest.
- A panel of judges will assess the speeches.
- The panel may pose questions at the conclusion of each presentation.
- Guests are admitted but are not allowed to prompt, cue or ask questions to any contestant.
- NO VISUAL AIDS.

### Junior & Intermediate Division

Junior and Intermediate speech participants can choose any subject that pertains to the beef industry, Chianina or Maine-Anjou cattle.

### Senior Division

Of the 3 topics below, you will select one topic to give a speech on. You will be allowed 1 (one) 3X5 note card.

- How has society's increased use of social media impacted the showing? Good or Bad? Provide examples from each the sellers and the buyer's perspective.

- Grass finished versus grain finished. Compare and contrast. What are the selling points and advantages/disadvantages from both the cattlemen and consumer on different varieties of beef.

- Pasture to Plate - labeling our product. Explain the different labeling found on beef products offered to consumers and the validity/cost associated with each.

## LIVESTOCK JUDGING

- Divisions competing are Junior, Intermediate and Senior.
- Contest will consist of at least four cattle classes and one questions class.
- Judging is individual.
- No talking is allowed.
- No oral reasons will be given.
- Please bring your own pencil and clipboard.



# CONTESTS

## TEAM GROOMING

- Divisions competing are Junior, Intermediate and Senior.
- Teams can consist of **two or three people** (must be from same state to qualify for state sweepstakes points).
- Oldest participant determines division.
- The animal, chute, equipment, supplies and power source are not provided and are the teams' responsibility.
- Chute placement is designated by show staff. Equipment must be contained in this area.
- Animals must be finished in 30 minutes.
- A team-designated member presents the animal for final judging.
- A panel of judges assesses the teams.
- No outside assistance is allowed during the competition.
- Judging criteria:
  - Team cooperation
  - Method
  - Final product
- Top 10 will be announced at the contest.

## SALESMANSHIP

- Divisions competing are Junior, Intermediate and Senior.
- **You will no longer bring your animal to the contest, but will sell the animal based on the criteria listed below.**
- Contestants attempt to "sell" an animal of their choice to a group of judges or potential buyers.
- Suggested information assembled in a folder:
  - **COPY** of registration certificate
  - Performance information
  - Breeding information
  - Sales discussion
  - Marketing decisions dictated by environment, customer base, etc.
  - Pedigree
  - Phenotype
- Judging criteria:
  - Organization of information
  - Overall presentation
  - Contestants will be expected to answer questions
- Contestants will have a **10 minute time limit** to complete the sale.

## SHOWMANSHIP (MAINE ORDER - SR., INT., JR., NOVICE)

- Judging criteria:
  - Overall presentation of animal (skill as a showman).
  - It is a **non-fit competition**.
  - No t-shirts provided, clothing at discretion of exhibitor.
  - No outside assistance allowed during competition.
- Contestants must show animals entered in their name.
- If no animal has been entered, the Youth committee will assign one.
- First through 10th place will be announced at the conclusion of each age division.
- **Cody McCullough Memorial Senior Showmanship** - 10 Senior Maine-Anjou finalists will be chosen. These 10 individuals will then return that night for the finals. Each participant will be required to fit the same animal and show them again to the judge(s) and be named the champion senior showman. The top 10 individuals will be announced that night. The top individual will receive a scholarship in honor of Cody McCullough.
- **\*\*Contest Scoring for Sweepstakes:** Showmanship will be the only competition that is held separately from Chianina. Each participant in the showmanship will receive 3 points regardless of how they place. If you choose to participate in both the Chianina & Maine-Anjou showmanship you will still only receive 3 points. You must be a dues paid member in both associations to participate in both showmanships.

# CONTESTS

## QUIZ BOWL

- The main objective is to encourage team participation while individuals learn more about the beef industry.
- **Contestants must sign up their complete team AT check-in.**
- Beef Quiz Bowl teams has to have four individuals. Teams will compete in four age divisions: novice, junior, intermediate and senior. (Novice will follow the junior age division)
- If a team cannot be formed with four members from the same age division, contestants have the option of recruiting a member from another age group. However, teams with members from different age groups must compete in the oldest member's age division.
- Quiz Bowl teams must provide the names and ages of the four contestants at the Junior National during check-in.
- At the beginning of each round, the moderator will ask four to eight questions Family Feud style, and each member of the team will need to answer at least one question. For example, the first question can be answered **ONLY** by the first person on either team. The next question would be answered **ONLY** by the second person on either team. Scoring of the family feud round is as follows: 1st question answered is worth 5 points, 2nd question answered is worth 4 points, 3rd question answered is worth 3 points, 4th two points.
- After the family feud round, contestants will be asked 20 questions. Before answering a question, a contestant must push a button which will trigger a light and horn. The moderator will acknowledge the first person pressing the button. Only the called upon contestant may answer the question.
- After the moderator asks each question, teams will have 15 seconds to press the button to answer the question. After being called upon, the contestant will then have 10 seconds in which to respond. In the case of someone answering a question before being called upon, that team will lose one point.
- Each correct answer will result in one point for that team.
- If an incorrect answer is given, the other team will be given a chance to answer the question.
- Top 10 will be announced at the contest.

- Awards will be presented to the top three point-earning junior, intermediate and senior participants.

## NEBRASKA HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

### NEBRASKA STATE REGULATIONS

#### GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Nebraska Department of Agriculture – State Veterinarian’s Office  
301 Centennial Mall South, Lincoln, Nebraska 68509-4787  
Phone: 402-471-2351

#### Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI)

All cattle entering the Nebraska State Fair grounds must be accompanied by a current CVI and shall be identified on the CVI. CVIs must list the Nebraska State Fair as consignee.

Each CVI must:

- a. Be issued by an accredited licensed veterinarian.
- b. Show name and address of owner or exhibitor.
- c. Show all required tests and/or vaccinations.
- d. CVIs must be issued within 30 days of the exhibition

#### General Health Requirements For All Animals

1. Representatives of the State Veterinarian’s Office will be in attendance to verify CVIs.
2. Under no circumstances may animals under quarantine be exhibited.
3. Only animals not showing signs of infectious or contagious diseases will be allowed to show.
4. Animals that have active ringworm, lesions, visible warts, dermatitis or abscesses will not be allowed entry into the Nebraska State Fairgrounds for exhibition.
5. The inspecting veterinarian may judge the ringworm to be inactive, if the lesion is not encrusted and hair has begun re-growth in the area and is so stated on the CVI.
6. All animals entering the Nebraska State Fairgrounds will be subject to examination by a veterinarian or a representative of the State Veterinarian’s Office upon arrival or during the show. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases may be immediately withdrawn from the show and held in quarantine at owner’s risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until properly released to return to owner’s premises following treatment.
7. Animals with warts that are visible by a hands-on inspection will not be allowed to remain on the premises.
8. Any animals that are sold or staying in Nebraska after exhibition must meet Nebraska import requirements. For information, call the Bureau of Animal Industry at (402) 471-2351.

\*\* If Vesicular Stomatitis Virus (VSV) is detected in Nebraska or any other state, additional requirements may be put in place.

#### Nebraska Origin

##### Beef Cattle

- A. Tuberculosis – no test required to exhibit. Must be from a herd not under quarantine.
- B. Brucellosis – no test required to exhibit. Must be from a herd not under quarantine.
- C. Trichomoniasis – There are no Trichomoniasis testing requirements for animals originating from within Nebraska.

# HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

## NEBRASKA HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

### Out-of-State Origin

#### Beef Cattle

##### A. Tuberculosis:

1. Accredited Free States or Zones:
  - a. Beef cattle – no testing required.
2. Modified Accredited State or Zone: Beef cattle which originate from a herd not under quarantine for tuberculosis shall:
  - a. Beef cattle – no testing required.
  - b. Originate from a TB accredited herd, with the accredited herd number listed on the CVI.
    - (1) Have obtained a permit for entry.
    - (2) Be individually identified with the identification listed on the CVI.
    - (3) Have tested negative to an official tuberculin test within 60 days prior to

entry, or

- c. Originate from a herd which has tested negative to an official whole herd tuberculin test within three hundred sixty-five (365) days prior to entry, and shall:
      - (1) Have obtained a permit for entry.
      - (2) Be individually identified with the identification listed on the CVI.
      - (3) Have tested negative to an official tuberculin test within sixty (60) days

prior to entry.

##### B. Brucellosis:

1. Class-Free states: no test required. Must be from a herd not under quarantine.

C. Trichomoniasis – Cattle entering Nebraska for exhibition purposes are exempt for the requirements of the “Nebraska Amended Trichomoniasis Import Order”. Animals remaining in Nebraska for any reason, other than slaughter, after exhibition, shall meet the requirements of the Order.
