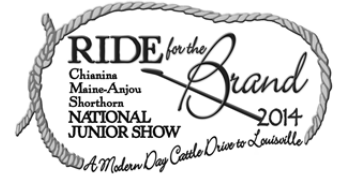


# Welcome to Louisville, Kentucky

## Please Read the following:

Make note of the following items that we feel will make your week at junior national much easier!



### Arrival/Departure

- You may arrive to tie-outs starting Friday, June 20 at 8 a.m.
- As you arrive, you will enter tie-outs first, proceeding to the barns. Tie-outs are located in "Lot K" off of "Circle of Champions Rd."
- You will be allowed to unload **TACK ONLY** into the West Wing on Friday, June 20 through doors W1 and W2 on the North side of the West Wing. **ABSOLUTELY NO CATTLE WILL BE ALLOWED INTO THE BARN ON FRIDAY!!!!**
- **It is recommended you pack your trailer in such an order to set up tie-outs first, stall space last.**
- **Due to building reservations, no one will be allowed in the Pavilion until Monday, June 23 at 8 a.m.**
- **Cattle will not be allowed in the barns until Saturday, June 21 at 8 a.m.**
- Maine-Anjou and Chianina cattle must be on the grounds and checked-in no later than 6 p.m. on Saturday, June 21.
- All cattle that are shown prior to the junior Maine-Anjou banquet are expected to stay until the conclusion of that event. Maine-Anjou heifers are released at the conclusion of their show.
- Health requirements for the state of Kentucky will be followed.

### Tie-Outs

- Tie-out areas will be on a first come, first serve basis.
- There will be rows of panels set up to tie to. Bedding will not be provided.
- If you choose to make a pen for your entries, you will need to supply your own panels.
- **NO PANELS WILL BE SUPPLIED BY THE SHOW COMMITTEE FOR INDEPENDENT PENS.**
- Tents will be allowed in the ties-outs.
- There is **NO** electricity access in tie-out area. **Generators are encouraged.**
- Woodchips will **NOT** be provided but available for purchase on the grounds through Feeder's Supply.

### Stalling

- All animals will be stalled by state. Stalling assignments have been made for each exhibitor.
- You will be expected to stall in your assigned area.
- **No porta-coolers will be allowed in the barn.**
- A standard amount of woodchips will be provided for bedding.

### Camping

- For camping reservations, please contact the Kentucky Exposition Center at 502-367-5380.

### Parking

- Vehicle parking will be in designated areas only!
- Vehicles **MUST** have a parking pass to enter the fairgrounds. Additional parking passes will be available for purchase at the gate.
- There will be a designated parking lot for trailers to be parked during the week.
- Tying cattle to trailers is allowed.

### Electricity

- There is adequate electricity in the barn if used wisely and correctly. It is possible to blow a breaker with the use of double blowers, single blowers, clippers and fans. If a breaker blows, contact the office.

- **PLEASE BE CONSIDERATE AND SAVE OUTLETS FOR THE SHORTHORN EXHIBITORS THAT WILL BE ARRIVING LATER.**
- Past experience of the facility and management says if a breaker blows more than a couple of times, a blower most likely is “bad” or the circuit is being overloaded.
- All fans, extension cords and electrical equipment must have a ground, must have safe wiring and must be in safe working condition. **Double check your equipment before you arrive at the show!**
- Keep the electrical boxes clear! NO feed, hay, show boxes, etc. will be allowed in front of electrical boxes, including electrical outlets on the outside walls, as per the Fire Marshall.
- All extension cords must be kept up off the floor, i.e. do not run cords across the aisles.
- No generators will be allowed in the barns at any time.
- Generators will be allowed only outside the barns and in the tie-out area.
- **No deep freezers, refrigerators, cookers, roasters, electric griddles or microwaves can be brought into the barn for the week.**
- Free standing fans will not be allowed. Hanging fans will only be allowed when attached to the tie rails or to supports attached to the tie rails. All fans must be hung above the stalling area.

#### **Entrance/Exit Doors**

- Entrance/exit doors CANNOT be blocked with tack, blocking chutes, tables, etc. This will be strictly enforced by management and the Louisville Fire Marshall.

#### **Contestant and cattle check-in**

- Contestant and cattle check-in will occur on Saturday, June 21 from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m.
- Exhibitors must sign up for all contests in which they would like to participate at the time of check-in unless already pre-registered. Fitting teams will sign up at junior national.
- All photographs are due at contestant check-in.
- AJMAA official show t-shirts will be assigned during check-in. These are to be worn during breed shows. Additional shirts will be available for purchase at the show.
- Each exhibitor will be given a meal packet at check-in as well as the additional packets they purchased. These will be good to any of the vendors for their “meal of the day”. The ticket is **ONLY** good for the “meal of the day” special.
- **DON'T FORGET!!!** This year it is mandatory that you use a **chuck roast** for your main course in the cook-off contest.
- Participate in the state basket contest. It gives you the chance to showcase your state, counts toward state sweepstakes and benefits the 2015 National Junior Show AND your state association.
- **NO LATE CHECK-IN.**

#### **Feed**

- Feed orders can be placed by contacting **Feeder's Supply** at (502) 813-7313. Please call **by June 9th** to place your orders and deliveries will be made to you at the show.
- A limited supply of non-show feeds will be available for purchase on the grounds.

#### **Hay**

- Hay will be available for purchase on the grounds through Feeder's Supply.
