

GENERAL INFORMATION

DEADLINES

- **ALL ENTRIES MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE.**
- Entry Deadline - MAY 3, 2021
- Late Entry Deadline - MAY 10, 2021 (Double Fees)
- No entries accepted after May 10.

OWNERSHIP

- **OWNERSHIP DATE** - Must be solely in the exhibitor's name by May 3, 2021.
- NO SUBSTITUTIONS WILL BE ALLOWED.

ELIGIBILITY

Participants must be current members in good standing with the American Junior Chianina Association (AJCA) and/or the American Junior Maine-Anjou Association (AJMAA) and cannot have reached their 22nd birthday prior to January 1 the year of the show.

AGE DIVISIONS

Age divisions are determined on January 1 of the year the show.

- Junior - 12 years of age and younger
- Intermediate - 13-16 years of age
- Senior - 17-22 years of age
 - For example, you must have a birthday AFTER JANUARY 1, 1999 to be eligible for this year's junior show.

DUES & FEES

- AJMAA dues - \$25. Junior dues must be paid in full for entries to be processed.
- AJCA dues - \$50 first time only; \$25 yearly renewal. Junior dues must be paid in full for entries to be processed.
- See Entry Form for specific entry fees.

RULES & REGULATIONS

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Exhibitors are subject to all rules and regulations of the AJMAA & AJCA. When an entry is made, exhibitors agree to abide by the rules and regulations established by the AJMAA & AJCA, as well as the rules of the show management. Entries found to be misrepresented and persons not abiding by the show rules will be disqualified. *All decisions made by the Show & Youth Committees are final.*
- Protests - Protests must be submitted in writing at least 24 hours prior to the beginning of judging or at the conclusion of judging. Written protests must be accompanied by a \$500 fee and three (3) signatures of current AMAA/AJCA members. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation and depending on the basis of the protest a decision may be withheld until a complete investigation is made. If the protest is upheld the \$500 will be refunded.
- All animals must be registered with the AMAA or ACA. The original registration certificate is required at check-in.
- Tattoos will be checked, must be legible and correspond exactly with the original registration certificate. We will not check tattoos on animals if they have been previously AMAA, ACA, state association or other approved program verified such as Ohio Best. Other than Brucellosis Calhhood tattoos, there shall be no other permanent identification marks other than those noted on the certificate of registry.
- The attempted surgical or non-surgical alteration or conformation of an animal is strictly prohibited, except for dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation. If an exhibitor's animal is found to have been physically altered the following actions will be enforced:
 1. The exhibitor will be banned from all AMAA/ACA shows for one (1) year from the offense.
 2. The animal will be banned from exhibition for life.
 3. If exhibitor is guilty for the second offense they will be barred for life from AMAA/ACA activities.
- The use of false tail heads, added hair or other materials to any part of the animal's body is prohibited.
- The dying or artificial changing of the existing color and color pattern is prohibited.
- No artificial filling (pumping).
- All horned animals more than seven months of age must be dehorned.
- No alteration of a Chiangus head is allowed.
- Any and all cattle shall be made available to have blood drawn or hair pulled for parentage verification, detection of foreign substances or the presence of altering. If recorded parent is excluded as a result of DNA typing, the owner can, at his expense, request the AMAA/ACA to determine actual parentage. Failure to determine parentage will result in disqualification of that animal from the AMAA/ACA herd book.
- Heifers exhibited at 20 months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy. Heifers used in embryo transfer must be accompanied by a certificate of positive fertility issued by a licensed veterinarian.

RULES & REGULATIONS

- The show superintendent will split classes as near to equal as possible.
- Participants must exhibit their own show entries.
 - **Exceptions:**
 - An exhibitor has more than one animal in the same class, in which another junior national participant may help by showing one of the animals.
 - Injury or illness (medical note from a doctor).
 - The Youth Committee will review other circumstances.
- Official t-shirts are required while exhibiting animals and will be available at check-in.
 - A separate shirt will be given for showmanship contest.
- Exhibitors must wear show harnesses to display entry numbers.
- Animal health commission rules and regulations of the host state will be enforced.
- Cattle are not allowed to leave prior to the conclusion of the show.
- Overhead fans are to be hung in the front half of stalls.

STALLING

- States are to stall together in assigned locations during the show. Each exhibitor will stall with their state. Chi's and Maines will all be stalled by state, together.
- **STALLING WITH ANOTHER STATE - If a scenario presents itself where you have to stall with another state, a fee of \$50 will be required.**
- **STALL REQUESTS** - If you have a specific stall request, within your state, please e-mail njhs.stalling@gmail.com. We will do our best to honor stalling requests, but make no guarantees.
- Stall requests will only be accepted via e-mail up until June 1. Any requests made after June 1 are not guaranteed!
- Please specify in your e-mail the First & Last name of each exhibitor you wish to stall with and the state you are from.
- The AJMAA & AJCA will assign stalls for each exhibitor within their states section.
- **NO SWAMP COOLERS/PORTRA COOLS ALLOWED.**
- **NO FAN CAGES OR BUTT FANS ALLOWED.**

TIEOUTS

- Tie outs are NOT preassigned and will be first come, first serve.
- You may NOT tie to your trailer.
- **Pens** are NOT allowed in tieouts.
- **NO TENTS** allowed in tieouts.
- **Butt fans and generators are allowed in tieouts.**

CONTEST INFORMATION

CONTESTS

- All contests will be combined with exhibitors from both the AJMAA and AJCA. The only exception is showmanship.

NEW THIS YEAR

- Livestock Judging score cards will be included in your packet. You do not need to sign up for this contest. You will be automatically entered. You will need to bring you score cards to the contest to participate.
- Public Speaking & Salesmanship will be a VIRTUAL contest. All participants will compete with a virtual speech and/or salesmanship presentation. Participants who sign up on the entry form will receive specific information on how to submit their online speech or salesmanship presentation.

CONTEST SIGNUP

- Quiz bowl and Team Fitting - Teams will sign up at check-in.
- Showmanship - You will sign up for showmanship at the time you submit your entry online. If you wish to participate in showmanship in both breeds, you must enter both contests. Dues must be current with both associations to participate in both showmanships. See specific showmanship rules for more info.

AWARDS

- First through 10th place will be recognized at the awards banquet, and presented a certificate & award.
- Team fitting, Quiz Bowl and Showmanship will be given their awards at the conclusion of the contest.
- No ties.

CONTEST GUIDELINES & STRUCTURE

- All contests, with the exception of showmanship, will be conducted jointly. There will be an overall Top 10 in each contest and age division.

DO YOU HAVE TO ENTER BOTH BREEDS TO BE PART OF THE CONTESTS?

- No. As long as you're a current **DUES PAID** member of either association and have submitted a cattle entry or the contest only fee you are signed up.
- YOU DO NOT HAVE TO PAY THE CONTEST ONLY FEE IF YOU ENTER AN ANIMAL.
- YOU DO NOT HAVE TO ENTER AN ANIMAL IN BOTH BREEDS.

CONTEST INFORMATION

PHOTOGRAPHY

- Divisions competing are Junior, Intermediate and Senior.
- Photos must be taken by the contestant during the past year.
- Photo may be altered or image enhanced.
- Photos must be taken by the exhibitor submitting the photo.
- Cell phone photos allowed.

SUBMITTING YOUR PHOTOS

- Entry deadline June 1, 2021
- Submit one (1) photo per exhibitor
- Please include the following information:
 - Exhibitor Breeder Number (Maine or Chi breeder number)
 - Exhibitor Name & State
 - Exhibitor Age Division
- All photos must be submitted via e-mail to maine_chi_photo@outlook.com

JUDGING CRITERIA

- Judging will concentrate on all aspects of photography.
- A panel of judges will review the entries.
- Winners will be announced at the junior national awards banquet.

OTHER

- Photos become the property of the *Maine-Anjou Voice* and *Chi Journal* and can be used for publication or promotional materials.

LIVESTOCK JUDGING

- Divisions competing are Novice, Junior, Intermediate and Senior.
- Contest will consist of at least four cattle classes and one questions class.
- Judging is individual.
- No talking is allowed.
- No oral reasons will be given.
- Please bring your own pencil and clipboard.
- Score cards will be in the packet you pick up at check in. You must bring your score cards with you to the contest. Please do not lose your score cards.

CONTEST INFORMATION

PUBLIC SPEAKING

- Divisions competing are Junior, Intermediate and Senior.
- **NEW THIS YEAR - All participants will complete in a virtual contest.**
- Speeches are to be the contestants original compositions.
- Notes are allowed.
- Speeches should be no more than six minutes long, points will be deducted for going over time.
- **NO VISUAL AIDS**
- Contestants will sign up for the public speaking contest at the time you submit your entry online. Virtual presentation times will be assigned.

VIRTUAL JUDGING CRITERIA

- A panel of judges will assess the speeches.
- Virtual speeches will be given live via Zoom. Contestants will sign up for a time to give the speech.
- The panel may pose questions at the conclusion of each presentation.

SPEECH TOPICS

- All age divisions can choose any subject that pertains to the beef industry, Chianina or Maine-Anjou cattle.

SALESMANSHIP

- Divisions competing are Junior, Intermediate and Senior.
- **NEW THIS YEAR - All participants will compete in a virtual contest.**
- You will no longer bring your animal to the contest, but will sell the animal based on the criteria listed below.
- Contestants will sign up for salesmanship at the time you submit your entry online.. Virtual presentation times will be assigned.
- Contestants attempt to "sell" an animal, genetic opportunity or group of animals of their choice to a group of judges/potential buyers.
- **NO Powerpoint presentations allowed**
- Suggested information assembled in a folder:
 - COPY of registration certificate
 - Performance information
 - Breeding information
 - Sales discussion
 - Photo of animal with footnotes
 - Pedigree
 - Phenotype
 - The use of visual aids is allowed.
 - Marketing decisions dictated by environment, customer base, etc.

VIRTUAL JUDGING CRITERIA

- A panel of judges will listen to sales presentation.
- Judges may ask questions during the presentation.
- Contestants will have a 10-minute time limit to complete the sale.
- Contestant must provide an online copy of sales folder to be shared with judges.
- Presentations will be judged on the organization of information and the overall presentation.

CONTEST INFORMATION

TEAM GROOMING

- Divisions competing are Junior, Intermediate and Senior.
- Teams can consist of two or three people (must be from same state to qualify for state sweepstakes points).
- Oldest participant determines division.
- The animal, chute, equipment, supplies and power source are not provided and are the teams' responsibility.
- Chute placement is designated by show staff. Equipment must be contained in this area.
- Animals must be finished in 30 minutes.
- A team-designated member presents the animal for final judging.
- A panel of judges assesses the teams.
- No outside assistance is allowed during the competition.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Team cooperation – Method – Final product – Top 10 will be announced at the contest

QUIZ BOWL

- Divisions competing are Novice, Junior, Intermediate and Senior.
- Contestants must sign up their complete team **AT** check-in.
- Oldest participant determines division.
- The main objective is to encourage team participation while individuals learn more about the beef industry.
- Beef Quiz Bowl teams must have four individuals. Teams will compete in four age divisions: novice, junior, intermediate and senior. (Novice will follow the junior age division)
- If a team cannot be formed with four members from the same age division, contestants have the option of recruiting a member from another age group. However, teams with members from different age groups must compete in the oldest member's age division.
- Quiz Bowl teams must provide the names and ages of the four contestants at the Junior National during check-in.
- Every team is required to have a team name.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- At the beginning of each round, the moderator will ask questions Family Feud style, and each member of the team will need to answer at least one question. For example, the first question can be answered **ONLY** by the first person on either team. The next question would be answered **ONLY** by the second person on either team and so on.
- Teams will receive one point per correct answer.
- After the family feud round, contestants will be asked another round of questions. Before answering a question, a contestant must push a button which will trigger a light and horn. The moderator will acknowledge the first person pressing the button. Only the called upon contestant may answer the question.
- After the moderator asks each question, teams will have 15 seconds to press the button to answer the question. After being called upon, the contestant will then have 10 seconds in which to respond. In the case of someone answering a question before being called upon, that team will lose one point.
- Each correct answer will result in one point for that team.
- If an incorrect answer is given, the other team will be given a chance to answer the question.
- Winners will be announced at the contest.

CONTEST INFORMATION

SHOWMANSHIP - NOTE AJMAA & AJCA RULES DIFFER

Each breed will continue to hold a separate showmanship contest and each contestant will receive 3 points regardless of where they place. If you choose to compete in both showmanships you will still only receive the 3 points that will go toward the overall sweepstakes. Awards will be presented to the top 1-10 in each breeds contest.

If you wish to participate in both showmanships you must be a **DUES PAID member in **BOTH** associations. If you entered a Chianina animal, but did not enter a Maine, you can still show in Maine showmanship if your dues are current or if you pay an additional \$25 to get them current.**

AJMAA SHOWMANSHIP - MAINE ORDER - SR., INT., JR., NOVICE (CHI & MAINE TOGETHER) JUDGING CRITERIA

- Overall presentation of animal (skill as a showman).
- It is a non-fit competition.
- Exhibitors must show in an exhibitor harness.
- No outside assistance allowed during competition.
- Contestants must show animals entered in their name.
- If no animal has been entered, the Youth committee will assign one.
- First through 10th place will be announced at the conclusion of each age division, with seniors coming back to senior finals that night.

AJMAA CODY MCCULLOUGH MEMORIAL SENIOR SHOWMANSHIP

- 10 Senior Maine-Anjou finalists will be chosen.
- These 10 individuals will then return that night for the finals.
- Each participant will be required to fit the same animal and show them again to the judge(s).
- Each participant will get 50 minutes to fit their animal.
- The top 10 individuals will be announced that night.
- First place senior showman will receive a scholarship in honor and remembrance of Cody McCullough.

AJCA SHOWMANSHIP - CHIANINA ORDER - INT., JR., SR., NOVICE (CHI & MAINE TOGETHER)

- Contestants must show their own Chianina/Chiangus animal in showmanship and the animal must be entered in the show.
- Tattoos may be verified after each heat.
- **CONTEST ONLY** juniors with NO cattle entered in the NJHS in either breed will be allowed to participate in Chi showmanship with a Chianina/Chiangus animal assigned to them by the Youth Advisory Committee.
- No bulls allowed unless that is the only Chianina/Chiangus animal an exhibitor has entered.
- The is a no-fit competition.

NOVICE SHOWMANSHIP

- Novice participants may use any heifer or steer entered in the NJHS.
- A responsible individual may accompany the novice in the ring.
- Novice showmanship will begin immediately following the conclusion of the first ring to finish. There will only be one division of Novice showmanship.
- Novice participants will not place, but each participant will receive an award.

CONTEST INFORMATION

PARADE OF FLAGS

- This is the state introduction and flag display ceremony.
- A representative from each state should bring their flag and participate.
- Each state will need to prepare a write up about their state and submit that write-up by June 1 to either Lindsey at lindsey@AMAAPC.com or Heather at heather@chicattle.org. This write up will be read at the opening ceremonies.

HERDSMANSHIP

- To encourage state unity and togetherness.
- States will be judged on Sunday - Wednesday.
- The first place state will be announced at the banquet
- This state competition will be judged on:
 - a) Organization of tack - 10 points
 - b) Stall card quality - 10 points
 - c) Upkeep of stalls and bedding - 15 points
 - d) Cooperation and teamwork - 25 points
 - e) Care and appearance of cattle - 15 points

INDIVIDUAL SWEEPSTAKES

- Awards will be presented to the top three point-earning junior, intermediate and senior participants.
- Points awarded in the following competitions are applied toward individual sweepstakes totals:
 - Team Grooming

 - Quiz Bowl

MAINE-ANJOU SHOW CLASSIFICATIONS

BRED AND OWNED (BULLS & FEMALES):

- If the dam of a bred & owned animal is from another breed they must have a registration certificate showing ownership. They will also need to have the pedigree added.
- If you plan to show in both the bred & owned and owned heifer shows you must enter in both shows. We do not assume that because the animal is bred & owned that you want to be in both shows.
- Exhibitor must be listed as breeder and owner on original registration certificate on bred and owned entries. Dams of MaineTainer females and steers do not have to be registered Maine-Anjou or MaineTainer as long as the dam is registered in another breed's registry and on file at the AMAA.
- If the calf's dam is registered with another breed, a copy of the dam's registration paper must be sent to the AMAA office to prove ownership in the exhibitor's name at the time of conception.
- **Bred and owned entries cannot be out of COMMERCIAL, FOUNDATION or NON-REGISTERED dams.**

BULLS:

- Bulls must be born on or after Jan. 1, 2020.
- Entries must meet all requirements of bred and owned entries explained above.
- Bulls must be TH/PHA free by parents or be free by test. Carriers will no longer be registered or shown.

COW/CALF PAIRS:

- The cow determines where the pair will show.
- Cows MUST be a registered Maine-Anjou, MaineTainer or MaineAngus.
- The cow must be owned by the exhibitor at the time the calf is born.
- Both the cow and the calf must be registered **SOLELY** in the junior exhibitor's name.
- Cows exhibited with calves at side must be lactating.
- Calves must not be more than 240 days of age at the time of the show.
- Calves (Bulls or heifers) must meet AMAA registration requirements.
- Calves must be registered by the day of the show.
- **Calves may also be shown as individual entries, but will have to have a separate entry and pay that entry fee.**
- Cows may be evaluated and screened out of the show on the basis of udder quality.
- Only natural pairs are eligible.

STEERS

- Must be at least 1/4 blood Maine-Anjou and registered solely in the junior's name.
- At least one parent needs to be registered with the AMAA.
- Must have a complete set of baby teeth.
- Steers are shown by weight. (Prospect - 900 and below. Progress - 901 and above)
- Classes are determined after weigh-in.
- Bred & Owned steers will show within the owned steer classes.

- Bred & owned entries can be still be registered if their dam is registered in another association.
- If the dam is registered in another breed's registry her pedigree must be added and on file at the AMAA.
- A copy of the dam's registration paper must be sent or e-mailed to the AMAA office to prove ownership in the exhibitor's name at the time of conception.
- Bred and owned entries out of COMMERCIAL, FOUNDATION and NON-REGISTERED dams cannot show.
- If entering a Bred & Owned MaineTainer bull, you will select Bred & Owned MaineTainer Bull.
- Bulls must be TH/PHA free by parents or be free by test. Carriers will no longer be registered or shown.**

BRED & OWNED HIGH-PERCENTAGE FEMALES

- 75% - Purebred (Brown paper)
- Exhibitor must be listed as breeder and owner on original registration certificate on bred and owned entries.

- We do not assume that just because an animal is bred & owned that you also want to show it in the owned show. YOU MUST ENTER IN BOTH SHOWS.

OWNED MAINE ANGUS FEMALES

- 3/8 - 5/8 Maine Angus (Blue paper)
- **Maine Angus refers to cattle with the following characteristics:**
 - The animal will have between 3/8 Maine-Anjou to 5/8 Maine-Anjou blood and have between 3/8 registered Angus to 5/8 registered Angus and/or registered Red Angus blood.
 - A registered Maine Angus female must be proven free of PHA and TH, whether identified by pedigree or test.

COLOR RULE: All qualifying individuals will be predominately solid black or red in color. White markings are only allowed on the underline and switch of the tail.

- Starting Jan. 1, 2019 - All animals that have qualified and registered as Maine Angus prior to Jan. 1, 2019 will retain their Maine Angus papers but will not be able to exhibit/show in the Maine Angus division, however, these animals are eligible to show as MaineTainers.

- All Maine Angus must be approved for color pattern. If your Maine Angus does not have an approved Maine Angus stamp on its paper, it will need to be brought to a designated area to check tattoo and color pattern.

Special Maine Angus Info:

All Maine Angus will show in the Owned Maine Angus Show. Bred & Owned Maine Angus animals will be noted in the program and a bred & owned Maine Angus Grand & Reserve will be picked at the conclusion of the Owned Maine Angus show. For example, if you get 5th in class, but are the only bred & owned, you will be 1st bred and owned for that class and will receive a class winner award. All first and seconds will return for the overall bred & owned Maine Angus selection. There will be no divisions.

- 1/4 - 5/8 Maine-Anjou (Green paper)
- Exhibitor must be listed as the exhibitor on the registration certificate.

OWNED HIGH-PERCENTAGE FEMALES

- 75% - Purebred (Brown paper)
- Exhibitor must be listed as the exhibitor on the registration certificate.

CHIANINA SHOW CLASSIFICATIONS

% RULE FOR CHI CATTLE

Breeding cattle must have a minimum of 6.25% Chianina blood to participate in ACA nationally sponsored shows such as the NJHS. This rule does NOT apply to Steers or Composite heifer show.

OWNED FEMALE SHOW

- CHIANGUS - All registered Chiangus and Red Chiangus (1CA, 2CA & PCA) females.
- CHIANINA - All registered Chianina & Chiford females.
- ITALIAN FULLBLOOD & HIGH PERCENTAGE - All registered females 50% Chianina blood and higher (including fullblood). If 10 heifers are shown, a grand and reserve champion will be selected in this show.
- COW/CALF DIVISION - Both Shows
 - Calves exhibited in the cow/calf division are not allowed to show in individual classes. All cows and calves must be registered with the ACA. The maximum age for calves is 260 days. No maximum age limit on the cows. The registration category of the cow determines the division in which the pair shows. Calves shown at the cow's side must be the cow's natural calf. The exhibitor may be asked to allow calf to nurse cow. The ACA minimum percentage rule pertains to all calves in the cow/calf division.
- COMPOSITE - All **registered** females that fall under 6.25% Chianina blood are eligible. There will be NO bred & owned show division for the composite show.

BRED & OWNED FEMALE and BULL SHOW

- CHIANGUS - All registered Chiangus and Red Chiangus (1CA, 2CA & PCA) females.
- CHIANINA - All registered Chianina & Chiford females.
- BULLS - All bulls, regardless of registration category, show together in one show. Age requirements for bulls: calved after Jan. 1, 2020.

Please note on heifers: We do not assume that just because an animal is bred & owned that you also want to show it in the owned show. **YOU MUST ENTER IN BOTH SHOWS.**

- Entries that list the junior member as breeder and first owner, or are owned in a sibling membership are eligible for bred & owned.
- If the animal is owned in a sibling membership, the following must apply:
 - Each sibling must have an active individual membership.
 - At the time of entry for the NJHS, it will be designated which junior will be exhibiting the animal for bred & owned via entry forms submitted.
 - The animal must be exhibited by the same junior for the entire show season (May-April) in order to qualify for bred & owned.
- Animals may not be co-owned with a farm or adult member.
- Calves born to bred females that are transferred from one sibling to the joint sibling membership will still qualify as bred and owned to any of the siblings in the joint membership.
- Dams must be registered with the ACA.
- Embryo calves do NOT qualify unless the exhibitor owned the donor cow.
- Foundation and commercial dams do NOT qualify unless the exhibitor can show proof of ownership of the dam prior to breeding.

CHIANINA SHOW CLASSIFICATIONS

STEER SHOW

- All steers must be registered with the ACA in the junior exhibitor's name by the entry deadline of May 3, 2021. Additionally, all steers must be weaned.
- Show officials will check the steer's tattoos to ensure they are legible and match the registration papers.
- There will be two divisions:
 - Prospect Steers – 900 lbs & lighter
 - Progress Steers - 901 lbs and heavier
- Steers MUST adhere to and abide by the same fitting and grooming regulations as breeding cattle.

CLASS BREAKS WILL BE DETERMINED AFTER CHECK-IN. THERE WILL BE NO DIVISIONS.

GRAND & RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION WILL BE AWARDED.

Bred & Owned Champions will also be selected.

STATE GROUP OF THREE STEERS

- Entries consist of three steers from the same state and shown by their respective owners. No limit to the number of entries per state. No premiums paid.

CHIANINA ALL-AROUND CHAMPION

- Contestants must be active AJCA members
- The All-Around Top Ten will be strictly points based. There is no minimum or maximum number of contests an exhibitor may participate in.
- To qualify for the All-Around Champion top award, the junior must exhibit a Chianina animal (bull, heifer or steer).
- Contestants with more than one animal exhibited in the shows will only have points from their high-point entry used in calculating their All-Around points.
- Contest points will be based on how the participant placed in their age division.
- Contest (except quiz bowl & team fitting) and class points for All-Around Champion will be calculated as follows: 1st - 10 points; 2nd - 9 points; 3rd - 8 points; 4th - 7 points; 5th - 6 points; 6th - 5 points; 7th - 4 points; 8th - 3 points; 9th - 2 points; 10th and beyond - 1 point.
- Quiz Bowl & Team Fitting participant points will be calculated as follows with the number of points given to each member of the team: 1st - 5 points; 2nd - 4 points; 3rd - 3 points; 4th - 2 points; all remaining teams/participants - 1 participation point.
- Winners will be announced at the awards ceremony.

AJCA HERDSMAN OF THE YEAR AWARD

- To be eligible you must be an active AJCA member and exhibit a heifer at the National Junior Show.
- Exhibitors are judged on sportsmanship, presentation of their heifer(s) and stall area, participation in events and their overall ability to maintain their own cattle.
- Herdsman eligibility requirements:
 - Participate in at least 3 contests
 - Be present at the show the entire duration
 - This must be at least the junior's 3rd Junior National Show
 - Must be in the senior age division
